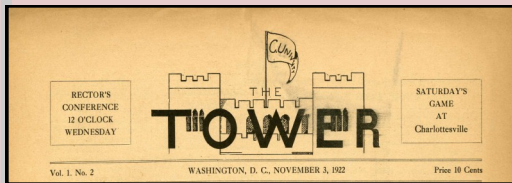
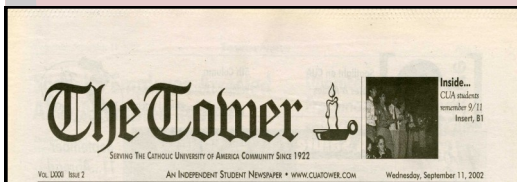

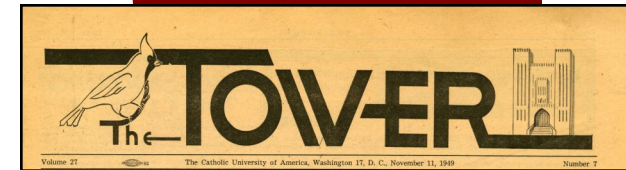

The Tower has served as the student newspaper at The Catholic University of America since the Fall of 1922. In an effort to preserve the newspaper, and to make it easily accessible to researchers, alumni, and all interested parties, the university has digitized the microfilm versions of the newspaper from 1922 – 2003 and put them online. The Tower Archive Online is available to anyone, from anywhere, and is keyword searchable. You can browse the newspapers by date or search by keyword across articles, advertisements and photo captions. You can print, download, or e-mail individual articles. And it's free!
